

Capturing and Using Video from a Camcorder - XP^{version}

These directions are for capturing video from a Canon Camcorder to a multimedia computer running Windows XP and Windows Movie Maker

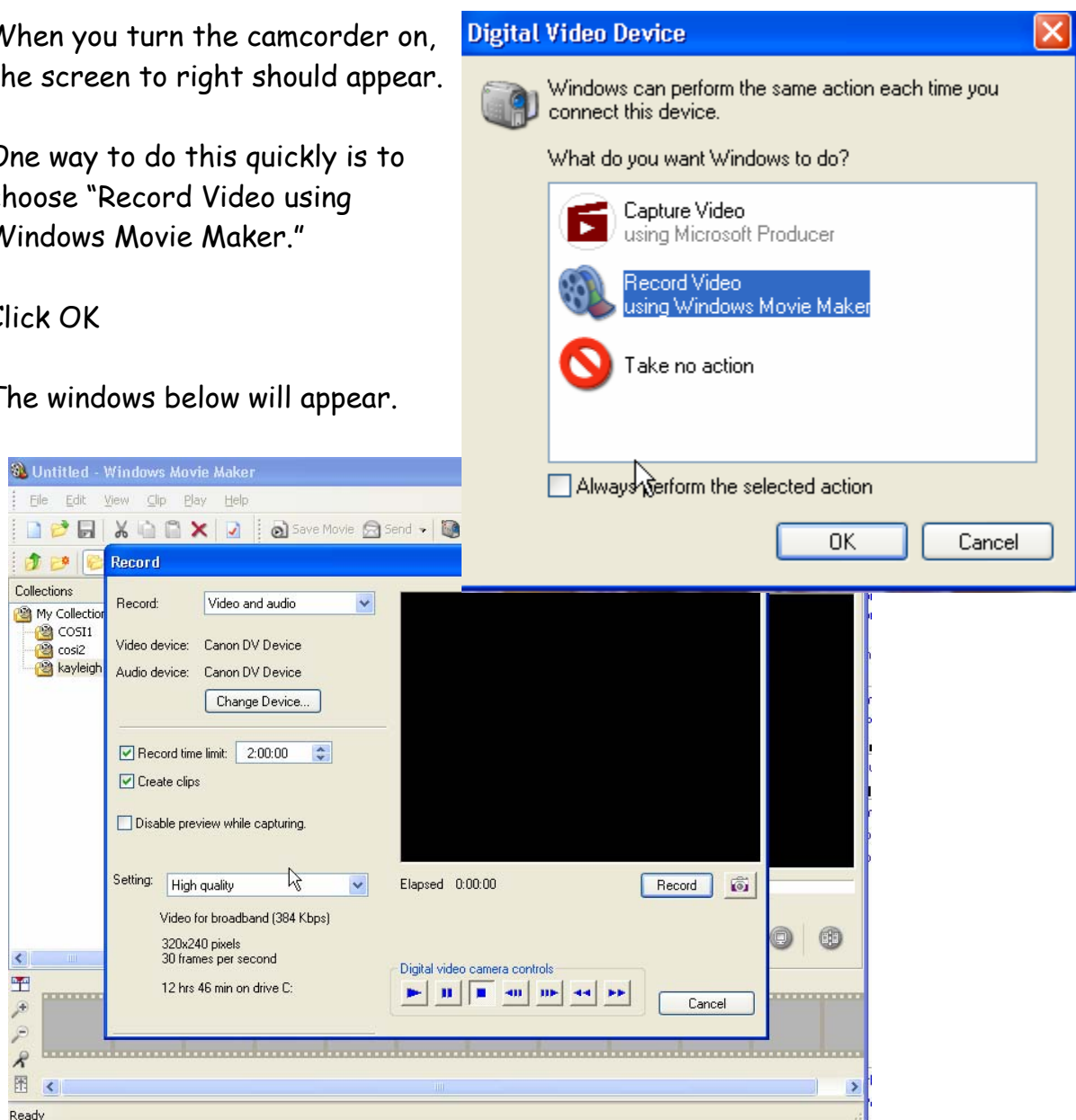
First, find the place on the tape that you would like to capture on the computer. It should be a short clip for use in most school presentations or portfolios. Turn the camcorder off and check that it is in TAPE position. Using a DV/firewire cable connect the camcorder to the computer. (The desktop requires a 6-pin to 4-pin cable and one came with the scanner. The laptop requires a 4-pin to 4-pin cable.)

When you turn the camcorder on, the screen to right should appear.

One way to do this quickly is to choose "Record Video using Windows Movie Maker."

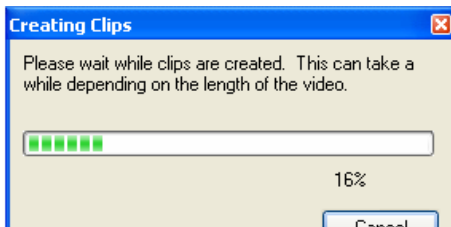
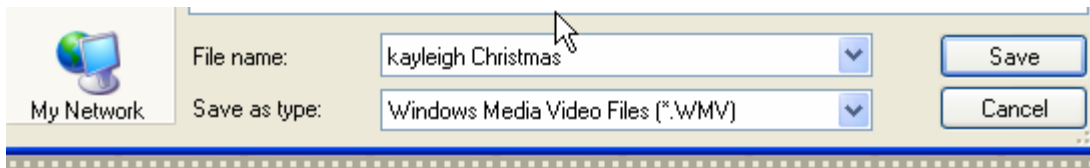
Click OK

The windows below will appear.



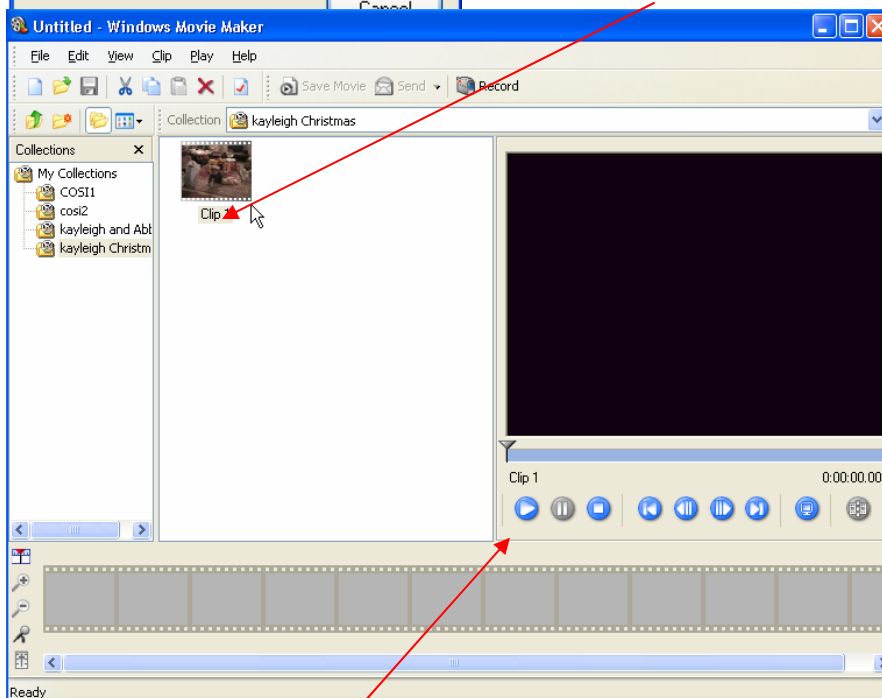
Press play (the oval FOCUS slide show ► / || button on the side of the camera.


Click Record in Window then click Stop when the desired portion of the video is captured. You will be prompted to save the video. Be sure to save it in you're my Video folder or any other logical place. Just remember where you put it. Click Save.



The screen to the right may appear. Just wait.

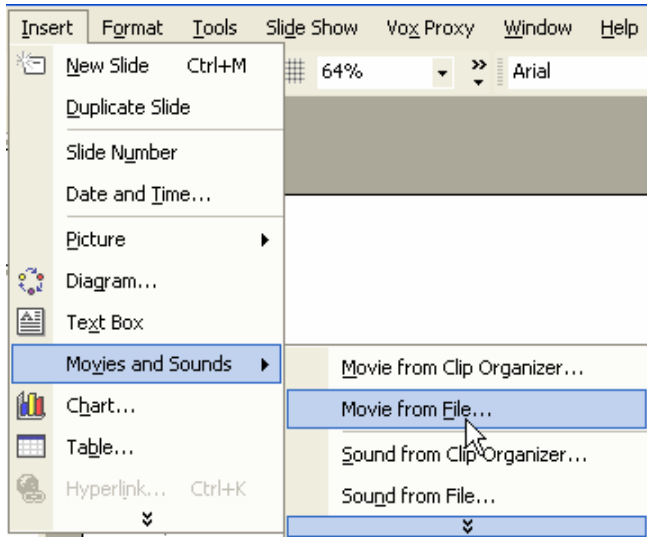
Click on the video clip in the upper left side of the window.

To insert into Word is a not as straight forward. Choose one of the following methods:

- ✗ The Insert Object can be used
- ✗ Or open the folder that has the video and drag and drop the video onto the Word file. The file name will need to be double-clicked to open the video. Then click "yes" to run the video.
