## **Industry Based Certifications**

## +Educational Aide 1 - Requirements:

Students must be 18 years or older.

Students must earn a final grade of 70 or better in two or more Education and Training Courses specified in TAC Chapter 130, Subchapter E, for three or more credits verified in writing by the Superintendent of the district where the credits were earned. One of the courses must be Instructional Practices or Practicum in Education & Training.

To earn a CTE endorsement, students must take a minimum of 3 classes for 4 or more credits in the same Program of Study, and must end with one Level 3 or Level 4 CTE course.
