School Parental Involvement Policy

Frazier Elementary agrees to implement the following statutory requirements:

3. **Frazier Elementary** will hold an annual meeting to inform parents of the school's participation in Title I, Part A programs, and to explain the Title I, Part A requirements and the right of parents to be involved in Title I, Part A programs. Reg. 71710, December 2, 2002) by:

8. **Frazier Elementary** will provide assistance to parents of children served by the school, as appropriate, in understanding topics by undertaking the actions described in this paragraph –

- the requirements of Part A,
- how to monitor their child's progress, and
- how to work with educators

9. **Frazier Elementary** will provide materials and training to help parents work with their child to improve their children's academic achievement, such as literacy training and using technology, as appropriate, to foster parental involvement, by providing opportunities for parents to learn about curriculum, technology and new resources to help their child to grow academically.

10. **Frazier Elementary** will, with the assistance of its parents, educate its teachers, pupil services personnel, principals and other staff in how to reach out to, communicate with, and work with parents as equal partners in the value and utility of contributions of parents, and in how to implement and coordinate parent programs and build ties between parents and schools.
